#RESPECT THE WATER

Alcohol and boating don't mix well



We want everyone to enjoy their boating experience on the Broads safely. Relax and have fun but please remember:



If you are driving a boat you must be in full control
You would not get behind the wheel of a car if you have been drinking – the same is true with a boat



Alcohol increases the chances of an accident
You are also less likely to react quickly under the influence of alcohol



Never enter the water from your boat, however tempting it might be
A combination of warm weather and drink can make a swim seem appealing – the reality is that the water can be very cold and there are dangers under the surface. Always be aware that there are sharp propeller blades at the back of a boat.



Always wear a lifejacket when moving around your boat or the waters' edge
Getting on and off the boat is when you are most at risk of falling into the water



Be considerate
